As your prescription drug benefit manager for the State of Delaware, we would like to update you with important information about the Maintenance Medication Program, which became effective July 1, 2009. As of **September 1, 2010**, the Maintenance Medication Program is being expanded to include more medications, and your co-payment may be affected. Maintenance medications are used to treat chronic or long-term conditions.

The enclosed list contains the medications to be added to the Maintenance Medication Program on September 1, 2010. You can visit <http://ben.omb.delaware.gov/script/index.shtml> to view a current list of medications that became part of this program when it went into effect July 1, 2009. After the **third fill** of one of these medications for up to a 30-day supply at a participating retail pharmacy, you'll pay double your co-payment if you continue to get up to a 30-day supply.

**To avoid paying this additional cost, also referred to as a penalty, get a 90-day supply of your maintenance medications.** Choose one of these two ways:

- 1. At certain retail pharmacies participating in a 90-day network:** You can obtain up to a 90-day supply for your 90-day supply co-payment. (A new prescription for a 90-day supply will be needed.) You can visit <http://ben.omb.delaware.gov/script/index.shtml> to view a list of retail pharmacies participating in a 90-day network.
- 2. Through the Medco Pharmacy<sup>™</sup> mail-order service:** You can order up to a 90-day supply for your 90-day supply co-payment. (A new prescription for a 90-day supply will be needed.) To get started, call 1 800 939-2142 to speak with one of our Member Services representatives or mail in the new prescription with the enclosed order form and envelope.

Please note that some medications, such as certain controlled substances or medications that are prepackaged, are not available in a 90-day supply and any current quantity or plan limits remain in effect. You should continue to get up to a 30-day supply of your short-term medications, such as antibiotics, at a participating retail pharmacy.
